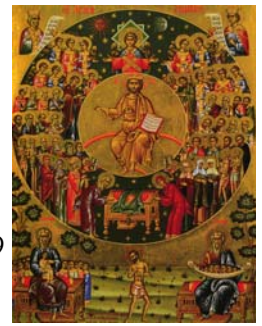

SCRIP CARDS - For those of you who aren't familiar (and a refresher for those that are), the Church offers gift (Scrip) cards to all Parishioners in the hall during coffee hour. The gift cards are available for a variety of retailers (Grocery, Dining, Home Improvement) in the area and for every card that we purchase, the church gets a percentage of that cards value (varies from 2% to 8%) - it is basically FREE money for the church. We started this program over 5 years ago and have made approximately \$7000 for the church - not bad but could be a whole lot better if more of us participated. Many of you might be concerned that in purchasing a gift card to Giant Eagle (which the majority of us shop at weekly) that you would lose your fuel perks rewards - that is not the case!!! You still get your fuel perks even if you are using a gift card to pay for your purchase. Here is an example of how buying gift cards can benefit you and the Church: Lets say that you need a new refrigerator from Lowes for your house and it costs \$1000. You could buy a \$1000 of Giant Eagle Gift Cards from the Church, go to Giant Eagle and buy \$1000 of Lowes Gifts and then go to Lowes and purchase your refrigerator with your Lowes Gift Cards. The Church benefits in the amount of \$40 (4% of the Giant Eagle Gifts) and you would gain \$2.00/gallon off your next purchase of gas (based on \$.10 for every \$50 spent and saving you approximately \$30 off your next gallon of gas (based on a 15 gallon fill up). You can also buy area restaurants and retail store gift cards at Giant Eagle. Certainly a win-win for all of us..... We would like to see this program continue but we need everyone's participation.
